It was an absolute honour to be invited into the **House of Lords to receive the Maxwell Prize 2024**. The prize is named after Lord Stanley Maxwelll, who was the Chair of Independent School Association (ISA) between 1909 and 1939 and was a driving force behind the association.

The surrounding of the House of Lords are impressive. It has the iconic Big Ben besides it. *Even Bella Bear came along to witness this special day.* Upon arrival at the Palace of Parliament, we were greeted by the Chief Executive Officer of ISA Mr Lockhart and by Lord Lexden OBE, the President of ISA who gave us a brief tour.

After the tour, we were then escorted to the Lords Chamber by Lord Lexden and were taken to our seats inside the Chamber. The Lords' Chamber is lavishly decorated and we were lucky enough to witness two Baronesses (Baroness Liang of Elderslie and Baroness Cass) being introduced to the House of Lords.

I was then presented with the Maxwell Prize glass trophy, a certificate and a gift voucher and after the ceremony, we were invited for an afternoon tea in the Peer's dining room – the cakes and scones were delicious. They also served us hot chocolate. I will never forget this remarkable experience.

Visiting the House of Lords was such a memorable day for us as a family. I feel so privileged to have been awarded the Maxwell Prize 2024 to celebrate my holistic approach to school and community life through my extra-curricular activities. But I could not have done this alone. I am forever grateful to my parents and my sister Annabel who always stand by my side. I am also extremely thankful to all the staff and fellow pupils at BPS who have supported me throughout my Bowdon journey. BPS will always hold a special place in my heart. But, as her new life began, she was shocked and distressed by the rejection she experienced. She soon realized that the only way to survive was to work twice as hard and be twice as good as anyone else.

We were amazed to hear that Mrs Makepeace-Taylor met Baroness Benjamin in person in the House of Lords! What a busy few weeks!



Having fallen on bad times, these unfortunate street urchins were taken into Weaverhall Workhouse for The Poor and **Infirmed** where they were schooled in the basics of the three R's; reading, writing and arithmetic. They were also taught how to make butter, clean clothes using a dolly and tub, grind flour from wheat, and make a rag-rug.

On our return, the majority of girls, and staff, were pleased to be back in the 21st century, however a few were intrigued by life in Victorian Britain despite it being very tiring and rather grim.
